Big Deposit of Red Marble Found in Izard County.

Melbourne, July 3.—A marble deposit estimated to contain not less than 60,000 tons has been discovered in the couthern part of Izard county, about a mile east of the White River division of the Missouri Pacific railroad, 20 miles south of Melbourne, E. A. Smith, in charge of the mineral survey, said today. The marble, which takes a deep red color when polished, weighs 178 pounds to the cubic foot, Mr. Smith said. He believes it probably is the only deposit of its kind in the state. It resembles St. Clair marble, but has a deeper red and seems more durable, Mr. Smith said.
