Fordyce—E. O. Olds, drilling contractor, and his seven sons have arrived in Fordyce to have charge of the new oil test to be made in section 18-11-11, nine and a half miles southeast of Fordyce, on the Aubrey Vance farm.

Mr. Olds and his sons received statewide publicity several months ago when they brought in a discovery well in Nevada county.

Drilling on Cleveland County Well to Be Resumed.

Fordyce, March 5.—Drilling on the Aubrey Vance well in Cleveland county, about nine miles southeast of here, will be resumed immediately. Drilling was suspended at the 2,900-foot level when difficulty arose over leases. At a meeting of the land owners in that section it was decided to give the company an extension of time for leases. The test is located about a mile south of the Markle and Dedman wells, drilled several years ago. It will be drilled to 3,800 feet and if the formation checks high, probably will be drilled to the big rock, unless oil or gas is found at a lesser depth.

Little Rock Syndicate to Drill For Oil Near Rison.

Rison, Feb. 18.—A Little Rock syndicate has taken over a block of about 10,000 acres of oil and gas leases in the central part of Cleveland county and plans to drill a well soon. F. W. Culpepper has been awarded the contract for the derrick timbers, and the derrick soon will be under construction. A well was drilled on this block a few years ago, and a showing of oil and gas was reported.

Leases Block Completed.

A. B. Diffie of Tulsa, Okla., and J. R. Lockhart of Fordyce have completed a block of leases, and derrick timbers will be hauled to the location of the well the last of this week. The location of this test will be on acreage north, east and south of New Edinburg, about seven miles south of Fordyce. A definite location will be announced the last of the week, when A. B. Diffie returns from Tulsa.

Derricks Up for Two Wells at New Edinburg

Rison—Two derricks have been completed near New Edinburg, 18 miles south of Rison, and plans are being completed for the drilling or oil test wells on two blocks of acreage in that section of the county.

The derrick on the Saxon-Tipton block is west of New Edinburg and near the Mount Lebanon Baptist church, in section 13-11-12, and near the site of the Word oil test well of several years ago.

The test on the east block from New Edinburg will be made on the Lewis Ross farm, section 11-11-11. Just when the wells will be "spudded" has not been announced, but it is reported that drilling is expected to start soon

Fordyce—Geological formations in the Ida Robinson oil well in section 36-10-11, Cleveland county, about seven miles southeast of Fordyce, are running as expected, according to J. R. Lockhart, who is in charge of operations. He said that cores are being taken in all formations, and that the hole is down below the 2,000-foot level. Night and day drilling crews are at work at the well.

Lockhart Takes Over Turkey Hill Leases

Fordyce-J. R. Lockhart who has drilled two wells about seven miles southeast of here in Cleveland county, but who has ceased operations has taken over the leases secured by O. L. Pennington in the Turkey Hill sector, three miles south of town. The oil test which was drilled on the Ida Robinson farm, section 11-11-36, has been abandoned as a "dry hole," according to Lockhart.

A. L. Carraway said that persons interested in blocking leases in the vicinity of the Hillman block, two miles north of Fordyce, have agreed to place \$1,000 in a Fordyce bank to be paid to property owners in the section to induce them to sign, and if the drilling is not started within southeast of here in Cleveland coun-

if the drilling is not started within 30 days, the money, held in escrow, will be paid to the landowners. The number of acres desired in this block is 5,000. Carraway said that under these conditions there should be no difficulty in getting up the block, and machinery owned by himself and Tom White which was used at the Bucksnort well will be used in drilling.

Leases Being Blocked Dem To Cleveland County

Rison—Indications point to a renewal of efforts to develop Cleveland county's oil possibilities. There is somewhat of a rush for oil and gas leases on land located west of Saline river, with four blocks of acreage in the process of being formed. A test well has been drilled on a fifth block within the past few months. few months.

South of Toledo on the east side of Saline river, a block of acreage has been formed and a test well on this block is certain to be drilled

Deeper Test Near Rison to Be Made

Drilling Is Suspended.
Fordyce—Drilling operations at the Lockhart well, known as the Ida Robinson No. 1, section 36-10-11, Cleveland county, about seven miles southeast from here, ceased recently. A drill stem test Thursday failed to show gas or oil. The shutdown is temporary and a new depth of 4,500 feet will be drilled for if leases that have expired can be renewed.

If there is failure to renew the leases, the Lockhart interests will move to a 10,000-acre block adjoining the Ida Robinson or, to the Turkey Hill well site in Calhoun county, three miles south of here.

Rison—Activity at the Ida Robinson oil test, near New Edinburg, is at a standstill, following a drill stem test made last week. J. R. Lockhart, who is having the well drilled, stated that he is making an effort to secure an extension on the leases. Preceding the test, there was considerable sale of leases and royalties in the vicinity. Drilling on a test well south of Rison is scheduled to start within a few weeks, it is reported.

Fordyce—J. R. Lockhart returned from Des Moines, Iowa, and reported that he is ready to start anew in the search for oil in this vicinity. He is ready to make a deep test in the Ida Robinson sector, seven miles east of here, he said, if property owners will co-operate. The location is section 36-10-11, Cleveland coun-

Drilling will also be started at Turkey Hill, three miles south of Fordyce, in Calhoun county, as soon as leases can be renewed. This is the same well that had a showing of oil when Pennington had charge of operations here, but which was abandoned by him.

Drilling operations were started at the well on the Moore estate, in Cleveland county, 15 miles east of here, recently. Blocking of 10,000 acres by the Lockhart interests in the Mt. Lebanon sector, where drilling is expected to begin July 1, resumes the search for oil in that territory.
